



Government regulation: Supply side



- Cambodia: Logs and sawnwood export ban?
 - Legality of logs and sawnwood exported to China and Vietnam? Special permits? By whom and to whom?
- Laos: Prime Minister Order 15 (May 2016): Export ban of unprocessed timber
 - Legality for the export of logs and sawnwood to China and Vietnam? Special permits?
 - FLEGT VPA negotiations: Stringent control over supply chains, including import & export in the future
- Myanmar: Logging ban in 2014
 - Legality of log export to China? Special permits too?

Government regulation: Demand side

- China: Oversea investment guideline? New Forestry Law?
- Vietnam: FLEGT VPA /VNTLAS Decree



 VNTLAS: Import from Cambodia and Laos is considered as high-risk and subject to stringent level of control

Other cross-border problem: Trade data discrepancy



- A huge discrepancy in trade data between demand and supply countries
 - China and Cambodia/Laos/Myanmar (e.g. Lao government reports no export of logs and sawnwood to China, whereas Chinese government reports some import from Laos).
 - Vietnam and Laos/Cambodia (same)
- What triggers data discrepancy?

What should we do?



- Encourage & facilitate bilateral negotiations between the governments of supply & consumer sides. Start with information exchange
- Regional approach for CSOs to work on cross-border topic (e.g. network?) connecting supply and demand country
- Others?
